PREAMBLE

The IQAC Cell of the college collects regular feedback through Students Satisfaction Survey (SSS) on Overall Institutional Performance and Curriculum along with feedback on curriculum & syllabus from different stake holders (teachers, alumni & employers). The Feed Back form has been designed by an expert team headed by Coordinator, IQAC and the members of the IQAC. The online feedback consists of items specific to the stakeholders and these are related to 5 points rating scale (1-Excellent, 2-Very Good, 3-Good, 4- Satisfactory, 5- Unsatisfactory) and one item is qualitative in nature for their open comments. Apart from the questionnaire as recommended in NAAC guidelines, this survey also includes questions related to few other aspects like infrastructure, library, admission, result, classroom teaching, Laboratory, Proctorial classes, water supply, administration etc. The survey was conducted during the end of the session through a structured feedback form. A total of 575 students from different streams participated in the survey by filling the feedback form which was allotted to them by concerned HoDs on their Departmental WhatsApp group.

Student's feedback is the effective tool of the Higher Education System to improve the overall growth of any institution as well as students' confidence and self-awareness. Students, when surveyed correctly, can identify potential issues that institutions may not be aware of. Hence, this online feedback Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) was conducted to assess students' satisfaction on different aspects. Feedback and views being collected from the teachers, alumni and employers on curriculum & syllabus are the catalyzing factor in accelerating the academic scenario keeping in view of pursuing higher study and creating more employability.

Abstract of general remark and suggestion by the stake holder for improving quality of the institutional curriculum & syllabus

Alumni Suggestion

- Need based faculty training programme may be undertaken for revered teaching staff member of the institution to have skill full attire on present syllabus.
- 2. Pre-size emphasis must be given to the practical classes to make it more interesting to the students.
- 3. Skill based training must be added in both B.Sc. & M.Sc. Computer Science courses.
- 4. Amalgamation of entrance oriented mock test series may be adopted in the curriculum to have more number of competitive Exam qualifiers for higher courses.
- 5. Frequent Seminars may be conducted to improve enthusiasm in research for both the students and to preserve research atmosphere in the institution.
- 6. The dissertation / project work in the Master degree curriculum is remained at the level of evaluation nature only. Steps may be taken to improve it and it should be compulsory for the students to have some societal application.

Students' Suggestion

- 1. More emphasis is to be given for practical exposure of the students.
- 2. Need more rooms to be converted to the Smart Class room.
- 3. The gap between ending of examination and result publication must be maintained and publication of result should be done in due time.
- 4. Arrangement must be made for the availability of more Ol Chiki books.
- 5. Courses like Cyber security / Android Development language (Kotlin) may be added in the syllabus of BCA for better students' exposure.
- Machine learning course may be added in the curriculum of MCA as it is the fast growing field in the era of Computer Application.
- Internship time should be improvised in technical courses like MBA, MCA, Computer Science etc.

Teacher's Suggestion

- Regional History topics may be incorporated in the Under Graduate and Master Degree courses of History Core Papers.
- DSE-III paper in Botany needs some specific plant taxonomy part to be added as per applicability.

ACTION TAKEN REPORT BASED ON SATISFACTION SURVEY ON CURRICULUM & SYLLABUS AND OVERALL DEVELOPMENT OF THE INSTITUTIONAL PERFORMANCE 2023-24

Resolution No. (IQAC) 1454 / Date: 30.05.2024

A meeting of the IQAC Cell under the chairmanship of Principal, Prof. Pramod Chandra Sahu was held in the chamber of the Principal on 30.05.2024 at 3.30 pm to discuss the feedback pertaining to curriculum & syllabus and overall development of the institution as received for the academic session 2023-24 through self-structured questionnaire from the end of different stake holders (students, teachers, alumni and employers). At the outset, Coordinator, IQAC presented the detail statistical report on the basis of survey questionnaire. All the members had participated in the discussion with their views to improve the quality of academic atmosphere and overall development of the institution. After thorough discussion following resolutions were made unanimously.

Resolutions

- The satisfaction survey report (single blind) is to be communicated to the HODs / Coordinators of the department for further improvement as the case may be.
- Multimedia resources like Smart Boards, LCD and other teaching and visual aids with Wi-Fi connectivity are to be provided to enrich students understanding and engagement throughout the classes.
- Worksheets and formative technics are to be used to assess students' understanding and adjust instructional strategies accordingly.
- 4. Hands on learning approach is to be used to increase the curiosity and enthusiasm for learning.
- 5. A more culturally inclusive environment is to be provided to enrich students experience.
- 6. To adapt teaching strategies to meet the changing needs of the students.
- 7. A joint meeting of IQAC Cell and Library Committee will be held on priority basis to discuss and review the books and journals available so as to meet the current requirement of the students'. Preference may be given for subscribing e-Books, different national and international repository.
- 8. Addressing the dissatisfaction expressed by the students over poor condition of toilets and sanitation facilities provided to them, the committee decided to take required measures to maintain cleanliness and proper hygiene.
- 9. The syllabus has been framed in well-organized manner as per the satisfaction survey and if minor changes required for employability aspect, BoS is the appropriate authority



for the revised syllabus. Intimation to this effect will be communicated to the HoDs and Coordinators.

- 10. The proprietor of the college canteen will be intimated to maintain overall good quality in food, hygiene and discipline.
- 11. Overall the college has received positive feedback from the stake holders which is to be improved in the long run.

The meeting ended with a formal vote of thanks to the members and chairperson.
